The Gathering

The Bishop of Leicester says

My brothers and sisters,
God has called us into the fellowship of the universal Church.
As members of his body,
Christ calls us to minister together in his name
and, according to our gifts,
to be instruments of his love in the world.

There are varieties of service.

All but the same Lord.

There are different kinds of working,

All but the same God is at work in all.

God of mercy and love, by one Spirit we have all been baptised into one body and made to drink of the one Spirit; we thank you for the gifts you have given to these your servants for the building up of the body of Christ.

Grant that they may continue in the life of the Spirit and walk in the light and obedience of Christ.

By the same Spirit, fill the whole Church with your overflowing love; give us knowledge and discernment of your will, and steadfastness in your service, until we all come to the unity of the faith, to the measure of the full stature of Christ, through whom we make our prayer.

Isaiah 61: 1-3

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners;

2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;

3 to provide for those who mourn in Zion—to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.

They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, to display his glory.

2 Corinthians 4: 5-10

⁵For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

⁷ But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. ⁸We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies.

Will you support each other as colleagues and work in collaboration, learning from the special skills of others and being ready to share your own?

All With the help of God, I will.

May God who has called you to his service, strengthen and equip you in every way, that you may build up the body of Christ and serve the world to the glory of God.
