Who are you?

A church has stood on the present site since 1220 approx.

Extensive restoration during Victorian times.

Thurmaston lies on the boundary of Leicester City. Some Thurmaston houses in the city are included in the ecclesiastical parish.

Thurmaston is currently made up of Residential housing both private and social. Retail Park and Industrial units.

Population around 13,000. Latest census states 33% claim to be Christian, 30% Of no religion, 25% Hindu and the other 12% either Muslim or minority religions.

There are plans passed to build 5,000 houses in or around Thurmaston

Four primary schools including one Roman Catholic, one C of E.

A small congregation with a big heart, and a big building.

A dedicated, hard working, PCC.

We have a thriving band of bellringers who continue to recruit new bellringers.

Where are you going?



Some of our congregation prefer a formal service and Living Hope Church has been planted to reach unchurched people in a different location and at a different time of day. Mainly Elderly congregation average age 73+ years.

A number of people (approx. seven) have recently left the church for various reasons, including moving out of the area and preferring a different style of worship.

With low numbers and age of congregation it is difficult to see how best we can continue with so few people being stretched to capacity.

The congregation are increasingly aware of the need to be welcoming.

We have different styles of worship, including Morning Worship and Holy Communion. We continue to look for outreach possibilities but do not have the human resources to increase our output.

Children and Families worker runs Bright Sparks Stay and play toddler group, holiday **Messy Church events and has good relationships with C of E school.** Upgrading heating and various areas of need within our church building.

Where have you come from?

A thriving Anglo Catholic Church. Three services each Sunday 8am Communion BCP. Choral Eucharist Rite A and Choral Evensong BCP. Adult and boys choir, RSCM affiliated, surpliced, SATB choir, which sang at cathedrals every year and made three LP records.

Choir disbanded Nov 1990. Active Sunday School up until 2014/2015. We had a curate until 1998. Two of which had four children each which helped to maintain Sunday School and Other than Sunday Activities for families and children. NSM followed in 1999 /2000.

Family service started in 1990's and remained popular until 2016. Children and young people taken to Walsingham residential weekends and Youth Camp. Last one attended was around 2014.

Regular coffee mornings and fundraising activities were held in the Old School until it closed during COVID / lockdown, and was subsequently sold. I don't know if there were any house groups initially. Some house groups but not a huge attendance from 1996 onwards. Two or three Alpha Courses over a period of 15 years. Lots of people serving in lots of ways.

What are you doing now?

With no Vicar Sunday services are engaging with visiting clergy or lay led. Numbers average around 18/22. Small prayer group meet four weekly. Small but dedicated group of people who will get things done as far as they are able. Two Readers covering the majority of funeral requests. **Children and Families worker covering Baptism Prep** One reader supporting person wishing to be confirmed in conjunction with Living Hope. Thursday Cafe Drop in. Food bank. Bright Sparks stay and play toddler group. Holiday Messy Church events. School involvement. Readers taking Home Communions for those who are not sufficiently mobile to get to church. Various people supporting elderly members of congregation. Good relationship with other community groups, i.e. Parish Council, Royal British L and Thurmaston Scout & Guides. With congregation members serving in many of the

organisations. We are in the enviable position of having considerable funds but have to plan carefully in current economic climate or we will run out of money in a few years.

Where are you seeing the Kingdom of God emerging?

Our Food Bank is an excellent outreach to our community helping those living in areas of deprivation. Good relationships are being made. We are able to extend the love of Christ to our guests whilst helping in a practical way.

Likewise, our Thursday Coffee Time is well-attended and a place for good conversations, including short reflection / prayer time.

Bright Sparks, our stay and play Toddler Group is very popular, offering simple Bible stories, craft and songs. Committed helpers chat to mums/carers. Some have brought their babies for baptism, some attend other activities but not on a Sunday. Good relationships built with families/carers.

Messy Church – held most school holidays and festivals. Attract a fluctuating number of participants with no reasoning as to why some are more popular than others. Good relationship with C of E school, we have three foundation governors. Children and Families Worker runs a Christian craft club, takes collective worship etc and schools come into church for seasonal celebrations.

What are you fearful about?

Having no Vicar and having to rely on lay or visiting clergy for services. Being forced into something we're not. Difference of churchmanship in Minster Community parishes. Difference of opinions within our own church towards Minster Communities. Continuous decline in numbers. Ageing congregation. Burn out for PCC members who work tirelessly to keep church and events going. Finances - we are fortunate to have healthy finances but with an old building requiring various improvements and operating at a substantial loss each year they won't last long We are aware of the need to balance the cost of any future re-ordering with eliminating our recurring annual deficits and achieve a balanced budget.





What are you hopeful for? Guidance - we often feel we are searching for the way forward without a Vicar. Help - we are a small aging congregation with a big heart and want to do more than our numbers allow.

We hope to retain the services of an excellent - and full - team, including Churchwardens, PCC Treasurer, PCC Secretary, Lay Ministers, PCC members, and employed Children & Families Worker. A new Vicar / Priest.

How you can pray for us.

Pray for strength and resilience - the crops are plentiful but the workers are few. For the growth of the Kingdom in our community, which will in turn provide us with more volunteers/leaders to do more outreach. For guidance - without a Vicar we often feel a little lost. We need to know if this is the right direction for us, or what is? United - within our own congregation.
