

RECOGNISE (7-13 July) is a national week of recognition for everyone involved in ministry with children, young people, and their families (CYPF). Sunday 13th July is a day for churches nationwide to celebrate and thank those involved in this vital ministry. Within your normal church service on Sunday 13th July, give 10 minutes to 'recognise' those involved with CYPF Ministry in your church. Follow this plan...

Thank:

Invite all your children and youth leaders to stand up or come to the front. Acknowledge, thank & invite the congregation to 'clap them' for all they give in serving children, young people & their families in your church.

Share: 6 minutes

It can be really encouraging for leaders to hear good news stories and appreciation from those they are serving . You could invite a few children or young people to the front to share a favourite memory or a particular thing they appreciate about their group.

Pray: 2 minutes

We can only do what we do with God's help and the power of prayer, it would be great to take some time to pray for your leaders and volunteers.
