




Dashboard for the benefice of Minster Community 4 Area I in the Deanery of Minster Community














Variations in attendance from year to year may be the result of changes in the number of churches that submitted returns, or changes in parish/benefice structure.



Average weekly attendance: attendance at Sunday and midweek church services & fresh expressions in October; Figs I & 5 do not include attendance at services for schools. Easter: Easter Eve & Easter Day; Christmas: Christmas Eve & Christmas Day. Baptisms: all baptisms & thanksgivings.

Marriages: marriages and services of prayer & dedication after civil marriages. Funerals: those held in church & at crematoria/cemeteries.

Because of pandemic-related church closures, Easter figures were not collected in 2020.

Census data: taken from the 2011 national Census and the 2018 population update.

Census statistics have been mapped onto benefice boundaries so are approximations.
